CHAIRMANS REPORT

Season 2024-25 was the 21st in the history of the BOIDC, and we returned to an 8 team competition with Centrals' reintroduction after a brief hiatus of less than a season.

For the first time since BOIDC resumed in 2019-20, teams played each other once in two day matches and once in one day matches.

After their time away from the competition, Centrals got off to a better start than expected, with 2 wins from their opening 4 matches. Meanwhile, Bathurst City had to wait until round 5 until they could register their first win, and City Colts took until round 7 to claim their first scalp. Bathurst City finished their season stronger than they had started, winning 3 of 6 post Christmas to finish in 5th place, even though the top 4 horse had bolted a number of rounds prior when the top 4 teams had broken away from the bottom 4 after round 11.

City Colts too improved as the season went on, and with an obvious injection of youth, managed to move themselves away from the bottom of the ladder. Rugby Union were a much improved team for the previous season, finishing third, while I'm sure Orange CYMS would be disappointed with the way their season ended after sitting in second place at one stage in the run home.

St Pats Old Boys gradually built into their season, sitting in third and even fourth at one stage, They made their charge in the back end of the season, showing their strength at the back end of the season to dispel any myths or theories about who the best team is in season 24-25.

Thank you to everyone who has made this season possible. Firstly thank you to the Committee of Management. Your support during the season helps make everything run so smoothly. Thank you to the Orange District Cricket Association and the Bathurst District Cricket Association and their members for enabling this Association. Thank you to everyone involved with the clubs especially those who help to put a team on the field each week.

Thank you also to the local umpires who give up their Saturday afternoon to stand in our matches. Thank you once again to the grounds staff who prepare our grounds. A special thank you to the City Colts volunteers and to the staff at Bathurst Regional Council and Orange City Council.

We had some amazing performaces during the season. Jed Cruickshank taking a triple hat-trick to swing Redback's match against Ruby Union strongly in his team's favour. Jed had an impact in a number of other matches with a couple of centuries, one part of a 187 run stand with Will Rodwell. Connor Slattery bagged 10 wickets in a match in round 14 for St Pats Old Boys as they beat Centrals outright within a day.

Cavaliers' Rory Kalnins joined the double century club with his 203 not out in the final round. Hugh Taylor scored 4 centuries across the season to help his Rugby Union side to within a whisker of the Grand Final. Bailey Ferguson received player of the year points in 9 of the 14 round matches to win the Player of the Year by a margin. Blake Kreuzberger just kept taking wickets finishing with 42 for the season and 15 clear of the next best. Three City Colts players scored a century in the same innings.

SEASON RESULTS

Round 1 - 12 October

Centrals returned to the BOIDC competition with a new look side from the one that started last season's competition. Round 1 saw them pitted against last season's runners up, in a tough reintroduction to BOIDC cricket.

St Pats Old Boys openers Andrew Brown (59) and Bailey Brien (28) made good first use of the Wade Park pitch with their opening stand helping their side to 1/94 at the drinks break. Cooper Brien survived two dropped chances before Centrals hung on to the third one shortly after the interval as Satveer Gill (4/35) and Kyle Nonnenmacher (1/31) helped slow the run rate as wickets fell until the Saints were dismissed for 184 in the 40th over.

Batting a player short after Hunter Hobbs injured his knee whilst fielding, the red and blacks toughed it out early but were unable to put together the match winning partnership they needed and succumbed to the St Pats Old Boys attack for 100, giving Saints the bonus point. Rupert Begg top scored with 34, whilst opener Angus Norton (20) and new keeper Freddie Wilkinson (20) made valuable contributions. Blayde Burke picked up 3/15, whilst Ben Parsons and Connor Slattery both bagged doubles.

Across town at Riawena Oval, CYMS captain Tom Belmonte made 82 from 93 deliveries to lead from the front as his team posted 186. Ant Spruce chipped in with 27 and Johnty French an unbeaten 25, while Jamie Cruickshank took 3/41 for Redbacks.

In reply, Bathurst City fell agonisingly short of victory, bowled out 1 run short of the CYMS total with 2.2 overs to spare. Opener Cohen Schubert top scored for his side with 57, while Liam Cain did his best to get Redbacks home with an undefeated 43. Peter Gott, Clint Moxon and Joey Coughlan all picked up 3 wickets for the green and golds.

At Bathurst Sportsground, Rugby Union successfully defended their total of 163 against Orange City. Openers Sam MacPherson (28) and Hugh Taylor (49) got Rugby Union off to a good start, but the

Bulldogs looked in trouble until Jayden Brasier added 43 from number 8. Wickets were shared among the Warriors bowlers, with Jarryd Seib, Brett Causer, Gus Cornish and Ollie Brincat each taking 2 wickets.

Harry Grindle made 55 in his first BOIDC match, at the top of the City batting order as the Warriors finished at 9/145 at the end of their allotted overs. Sam MacPherson topped off a good match, bagging the first 5 wicket haul of the BOIDC season, taking 5/31 from his 6 overs.

Cam Laird (85), Matt Corben (47), Hugh Middleton (46) and Tom Blowes (33) all made useful contributions in Cavaliers total of 8-267. Connor Brown was best with the ball taking 4/29. Colts finished with 8-190 from their 40 overs with Cooper Stephen topping the scoring with 56 and Russell Gardner making 30. Dan O'Reilly claimed 3/35 to be the best of the bowlers and help his side to the bonus point.

Round 2 – 19 October

In Saturday's second round of the BOIDC competition, St Pats Old Boys' Ben Parsons decimated the Orange CYMS top order, taking 5/9 from his 8 overs in their match at Bathurst Sportsground. Parsons took 5 of the first wickets to fall with CYMS slumping to 7/35 as Connor Slattery chimed in with 2/11 off his 8 overs. Clint Moxon (32) and Bn Orme (15) helped to put some respectability in their teams score before they were bundles out for 89.



St Pats Old Boys lost a couple of early wickets in the chase,

before Bailey Brien (42 no) and Connor Slattery (34 no) combined for a 67 run partnership to see their team home in the 22nd over, snaring a bonus point in the process.

Over the road at Morse Park, Centrals secured their first win on the season with a 47 run victory over Bathurst City, and in the process leapfrogging into 3rd place. Batting first, Centrals posted 170 with Freddie Wilkinson top scoring with 56 and Satveer Gill making 46 off 43 balls at number 7. Blake Kreuzberger took 3/21 for Redbacks to be the best of the bowlers, with Jamie Cruickshank (2/31) and Jed Cruickshank (2/37) bagging doubles.

After a quick start from openers Matt Holmes (20) and Liam Cain (26), the loss of regular wickets curtailed the Bathurst City chase, as they eventually folded for 123 to give Centrals the bonus point. Spinner Josh Dawson (3/17 off 8) was the pick of the Centrals bowlers, with Rowan Dray (2/26) and Aijdan Mannering (2/27) the other multiple wicket takers.

At Bloomfield Oval, Cavaliers opener Bailey Ferguson dispatched the Rugby Union bowlers as he top scored with 73 from 59 deliveries. Rory Kalnins also made a run a ball 65 as Cavaliers finished on 202. After his 5 wicket haul in round 1, Sam MacPherson was again in the wickets taking 3/48, but it was Tanvir Singh who had the more impressive figures, taking 3/12.

Rugby Union were unable to chase down the Cavaliers total as they finished their allotted overs at 8-181. Tanvir Singh was best with the bat, making 59, with Jarrod Edwards (34) and Flynn Taylor (24) also making useful contributions. Dan O'Reily picked up 3/22 to be the best of the Cavaliers bowlers, with Josh Ward taking 2/19 from his 7 overs.

Orange City also got off the mark with a win over City Colts at Wade Park. After losing the toss and being sent in, Orange City lost opener Brett Causer early before Harry Grindle and Fletcher Byrne combined to take the total to 39 before Byrne fell victim to Dave Rogerson. When Grindle fell a short while later to Dave Henderson, the Warriors were 3/47.

Shaun Grenfell (70no) was joined at the crease by skipper, Ed Morrish and the pair added a neat 50 to get the City innings rolling again before Morrish was stumped off the bowling of Lochlan Shoemark. Ryan Smith combined with Grenfell to add another 42 to the score before Smith fell to Dan Casey and then shortly after Lochlan Shoemark claimed his 2nd victim for the day, removing Tom Markey. City added a few more runs in the remaining overs to finish their 40 overs at 6/165. Dave Henderson (2/17) and Lochlan Shoemark (2/28) were the best of the Colts bowlers.

Lochlan Shoemark then top scored with 43 as the City Colts chase fell 9 runs short of victory. Dan Casey (33) and Russell Gardner (28) also made runs before Ed Morrish (3/17) changed the momentum of the match with his late wicket taking spell. Morrish was ably supported by Brett Causer (2/24) and Hayden Griffith (2/30).


Round 3 – 26 October

Round 4 - 2 & 9 November

Day 1

After winning the toss and batting at Bloomfield Oval, Orange City made the most of the batting conditions as they were dismissed in the last over of the day for 305. A 3rd wicket partnership of 136 runs between Fletcher Byrne and Shaun Grenfell was the catalyst for the City total, while Ollie Brincat and Hayden Griffith added a further 62 for the 9th wicket to get their side past 300. Orange CYMS will start their innings next week.

After being sent in a Loco Oval, Centrals recovered from being 3/37 at one stage to post 243. A 107-run partnership between skipper Angus Norton and Josh Dawson helped get their team back on track, while Dave Henderson bagged 5 wickets for City Colts.

At the Sportsground, Cavaliers won the toss and sent Redbacks in, dismissing the home side for 156. Cavaliers have knocked 34 off their chase by stumps.

After electing to bat first in their match against St Pats Old Boys at Morse Park 1, Rugby Union backed up their innings of 218 by taking 4 Saints wickets before stumps.

Day 2

St Pats Old Boys have slipped to 4th after their loss to Rugby Union. Flynn Taylor was the star for Rugby Union with the ball, finishing with 7 wickets to see his team wrap up first innings points against St Pats Old Boys. The win moved Rugby Union up one place on the ladder, into second.

Round 8 - 21 December

On the back of a 157 run partnership for the second wicket between Bailey Brien (117 off 109) and Cooper Brien (81 off 57), St Pats Old Boys were able to hold off a late charge from Orange City in a high scoring match at Riawena Oval on Saturday.

The first day of round 14 has been a day of rare feats as, among other things, a double century was scored in Orange and a 10-wicket match haul was taken in Bathurst.




